Tromatized: A Conversation with Lloyd Kaufman Added April 22, 2011

Lloyd Kaufman is a scoundrel to the studio system, a rebel to the film festival independents and a hero to the filmmakers who don't fit into the models that are general accepted as what movies are supposed to be. His production company Troma Entertainment (co-founded with partner Michael Herz) has been making movies with titles like "The Toxic Avenger," "Class of Nuke 'Em High" and "Tromeo and Juliet" for almost 40 years.

The films have one thing in common: They are fun. Kaufman's films don't take themselves too seriously. Instead, they celebrate true independence, where the boundaries of what is considered acceptable has no bounds. A graduate of Yale University, Kaufman is fiercely intelligent and incredibly driven, and despite his outlier status, he has an incredible track record of profitable releases.

TromaDance, taking place April 22–23 in Asbury Park, N.J., was founded on the same principles with which Kaufman makes his films: independently, on a budget and free from the influence of the Hollywood studio system.

Moving Pictures: You and I have actually met on a couple occasions, but it was probably in the malaise of Comic-Con. We did a move called "Comic Book: The Movie" years ago.

Lloyd Kaufman: Oh yeah! Sure, I've seen it.

MP: I just saw your IMDb. It's not listed.

Kaufman: It's not? I'm in that movie?

MP: You're in it.



Kaufman: I thought I got cut out. I don't think I'm in it. Am I in it?

MP: You're definitely in it.

Kaufman: Oh, thank you.

MP: I'm a fan. I read "Make Your Own Damn Movie!" years ago. You have the "Your Own Damn Movie!" franchise.

Kaufman: That's the franchise. "Produce Your Own Damn Movie!," "Direct Your Own Damn Movie!," and the next one is going to be "Write Your Own Damn Book About Making Your Own Damn Movie!"

MP: Is that true?

Kaufman: No, I think after "Sell Your Own Damn Movie!" I have to move on to something else.

MP: "Watch Your Own Damn Movie!"?

Kaufman: Exactly. "Blow Your Own Damn Brains Out!"

MP: I actually saw you guys at Cannes one year too.

Kaufman: Yep, we still do that.

MP: It's the funniest thing!

Kaufman: Well, you thought it was funny. Most of the industry do not think it's funny. We did a documentary about Cannes too. I don't know if you've ever seen that.

MP: I have not.

Kaufman: Ah, you must. It's called "All the Love You Cannes!" You can see it for free on Hulu.

MP: That's very Beatles.

Kaufman: It concerns Cannes in the year 2001, I think, or the year 2002. And it was in a bunch of film festivals. It's pretty extreme — I mean, it really shows us in the worst possible light.

MP: That's one of the things I do love about you.

Kaufman: Well, you should check out "Direct Your Own Damn Movie!" because half of it is what I do, and the other half is successful directors who have either come up through Troma ranks or ones I've worked with or ones sort of influenced by — Eli Roth and James Gunn — and I think there's some more mainstream directors too who I've just been friendly with, my contemporaries, but far more successful. It's a good book.

MP: Success is measured in different ways.

Kaufman: Well, you know what I mean, but "Direct Your Own Movie!" has directors who are doing no-budget movies to, you know, Roger Corman to Joe Dante to James Gunn; I think Stan Lee might have a little piece in there. And then the other half is sort of my theory of how I do the Troma movies.

MP: Right, which is in some ways similar and some ways not. So I guess the first thing we should talk about is TromaDance.

Kaufman: Yes, absolutely. It actually goes back to my days with Trey Parker and Matt Stone. When they were completing "Cannibal! The Musical," they insisted on going out to Sundance, and I had resisted on going to Sundance mainly because I sensed it was not for me. But I agreed to go. I figured I'd go skiing. This was about 15 years ago, but I think we were all so shocked at how rude and how unpleasant the Sundance atmosphere was.

So we decided to set up a festival at the same time and same place as Sundance in Park City, Utah, where there was no entry fee. You didn't have to pay to submit your movies, you could see the movies for free, and no-VIP policy. And we did it there for 10 years. And then we noticed, in about the seventh or eighth year, we had got quite a bit of interesting publicity. One year the front page of the Salt Lake City Tribune was all about TromaDance, the opening day of Sundance, and it was when I was at my [most] vociferous because we had had volunteers for TromaDance getting arrested by Park City police because they were handing out leaflets.

So we moved. Two years ago we moved to Asbury Park, N.J. And of course New Jersey is the home of the Toxic Avenger and Tromaville — all our movies are set in Tromaville, N.J. And Asbury Park actually wanted us, which was kind of cool after 10 years of being hated. There are so many deserving movies, and some of them may even be 10 years old that nobody ever got to see because they weren't in any movie theaters and they never got on TV or into Blockbuster or whatever. So, you know, we play some of those movies too, although most of what we play are — if you go to www.tromadance.com, we've got the selections for this year.



MP: How do you support it?

Kaufman: Well, Troma has employees who give their time. So we have a staff. And then we have fans. Right now I think we've got 12 fans in and around Asbury Park who are putting posters in shop windows and just doing what needs to be done. Asbury Park is not nearly as expensive. If there's a deficit, there's no revenue, so it's not a very good business model, but we [have] some sponsors because ... again, TromaDance gets a fair amount of exposure and it's got kind of an interesting street cred.

MP: So who chooses the movies?

Kaufman: We have a program director, who has been our director for I think maybe 10 years. Jonathan Lees is his name. He used to work for Troma but now he — I'm not sure what he does, but he's in the film business. He's very intellectual ... and anyway, he's the program director, and he has two or three other people who screen the movies and somehow they make their selections.

MP: I know I'm putting you in a tough position with this question, but I also think that a lot of that comes from the fact that your "Lloyd Kaufman" — is it like Steve Jobs leaving Apple?

Kaufman: I've had a partner named Michael Herz, my life partner, who is very averse to any kind of public appearance, but he does exist. And he is totally Tromatic, he just doesn't appear, and he just is not into the actual content. He was for 20 years and then he stopped. I mean Roger Corman stopped directing movies. Michael's the same way.

MP: But Roger Corman is still very identifiable with his brand.

Kaufman: Yeah, oh, absolutely. But "The Toxic Avenger" has a life of its own. I mean, Troma, we own about a thousand movies, so if I get hit by a bus ... certain of these movies — "Kabukiman," "Poultrygeist," "Tromeo and Juliet" — they're being remade now.

MP: Today indie filmmakers have Final Cut Pro on their systems, they have After Effects, digital everything. So what would your recommendation for independent filmmakers be in terms of using the modern technologies?

Kaufman: Well the good news is, and that's part of why you might want to read my recent books, is in "Make Your Own Damn Movie!" I was arguing for celluloid. The digital technology had not come up to the level I liked. But since then, and part of it is because I've acted in these movies — like the guys who made "Crank." They're big Troma fans, [and] they put me in a couple of their movies. And they made "Gamer" with Gerard Butler and some other people, and that was the first major movie to use the RED camera. And I filmed behind the scenes for my DVD box sets. I do DVD box sets to go with the books. So I got a pretty good lesson on the RED when "Gamer" was being made, which was a while back. And there's no question that the digital technology is mainly better than celluloid right now, so I'm all for it! I mean, we've been shooting digital, and my next movie, I'll probably use the RED or equivalent.

MP: One of the things I saw in your bio is that you're a big advocate of Internet neutrality ...

Kaufman: Well, the Internet is the last democratic medium. It's our last hope of having any kind of, you know — the major media ignores the independent. A myriad of people have come out of our loins, and not to mention the fact we own a building here and we've put people to work here who would certainly be on welfare. Not one New York media medium — newspaper, TV, radio, not one — mentioned that it was Troma's 35th year, the longest running independent movie studio in history probably, in New York! Nothing. We're not part of the gang. We're not part of the elite.

The reason I ran for chairman of the Independent Film and Television Alliance, the only reason I ran, was so that I could use our treasury to lobby in Washington to fight the consolidation of media and also to fight to preserve neutrality. And we did f–k up the Comcast merger, we threw a monkey wrench into it, and they now have been talking to us independents. And we worked out a deal — not Troma, but the IFTA — there's a deal where Comcast is required to do certain things, to reach out to the independent producers of television, because television is so closed to the independent TV producers. Through the lobbying, we accomplished something on the media consolidation front. But 'Net neutrality, our members are not quite aware what that is, so I'm kind of waging my own fight there.

MP: Now do most people know your background? Like, that you're a Yale graduate?

Kaufman: I don't think so, no. I don't really talk about it much. I think I talked about it a little bit in my first book, which was a memoir.

MP: I don't know if people know where you came from or where your business savvy comes from and your love of films — you know, where all that collides.

Kaufman: Well, you know, there are so many young people who want to make movies, and they don't read books, they don't go to school, they don't travel. What are they going to make movies about? They've got nothing to say! They say, "Okay, let's make a zombie movie!" My main advice to the young people is to do something you really believe in, because otherwise it ain't worth it.

MP: Absolutely, and I know I've always found directing to be the most painful thing in the world. Now I know you've done a lot of that.

Kaufman: Oh, it's horrible! But writing is worse. I'm on my third writer now. I have an attention-span problem, so I write with people. It took five years to get a screenplay on "Tromeo and Juliet." I wrote a draft, I wrote with somebody, and it was five years and then finally James Gunn came along and he was brilliant.

MP: So let me ask you a final question: What are you thinking about 3-D and how that is going to affect the future of Troma and Troma projects?

Kaufman: I don't think it's for me. In terms of my own mindset, I have absolutely no interest. I hated "Piranha 3." I thought it was horrible. I thought the 3-D was a distraction. I know they had a talented director, that French guy [Alexandre Aja], so my guess is the 3-D f—ked him up and that he had to pay attention to the stupid 3-D, which was incredibly unimpressive.
